No. 2 Constitutional Amendment, Article II, Section 5; Article XI, Sections 2 and 5 **Abolishing the Constitution Revision Commission**

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to abolish the Constitution Revision Commission, which meets at 20year intervals and is scheduled to next convene in 2037, as a method of submitting proposed amendments or revisions to the State Constitution to electors of the state for approval. This amendment does not affect the ability to revise or amend the State Constitution through citizen initiative, constitutional convention, the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission, or legislative joint resolution.

No. 3 Constitutional Amendment, Article VII, Section 6; Article XII Additional Homestead Property Tax Exemption for Specified Critical Public Services Workforce

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to authorize the Legislature, by general law, to grant an additional homestead tax exemption for nonschool levies of up to \$50,000 of the assessed value of homestead property owned by classroom teachers, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, child welfare services professionals, active duty members of the United States Armed Forces, and Florida National Guard members. Vote On Election Day

Registered voters who choose to vote on Election Day must cast their ballot at their assigned polling place. Polls are always open from 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Refer to your Voter Information Card to find the name and address of your polling place.

Precinct boundaries were updated in May of this year after redistricting to align our precincts with the new districts. Changes were made to balance voter populations in neighboring precincts. Two smaller precincts were combined into a larger facility to safely accommodate the expected turnout.
